Introduction

The Association of European Schools of Planning (AESOP) was established in 1987 in Dortmund, Germany as an organisation of schools and university departments that teach and conduct research within the field of urban and regional planning. Since 1992 we have been established as a non-profit making association under Belgian law, and now have 172 members spread widely across Europe and beyond.

AESOP has grown to establish a strong discipline network across Europe to improve planning education and the dissemination of good practice in teaching and research. Several organisations have supported this endeavour. Between 1997 - 2001, EU DG XXII provided financial support under the Socrates Thematic Network Project programme to enable us to improve contacts between the main planning schools and to promote further development of the discipline. Similarly the Fannie Mae Foundation has sponsored the AESOP annual Congress since 1997, ensuring the continuation of a rich housing research track in the congress programme and the publication of track papers.

AESOP collaborates with organisations with similar aims. We held a very successful joint congress with the American Collegiate Schools of Planning (ACSP) in Toronto in 1996. This will be repeated in 2003 in Leuven, Belgium. This year we jointly hosted the World Planning Schools Congress in Shanghai with the American Collegiate Schools of Planning (ACSP) and the Asian Planning Schools Association (APSA). We work closely with the International Society of City and Regional Planners (ISOCARP) and the European Council of Town Planners (ECTP) on issues affecting the profession. We were very proud to support the inception of a European planning student association PLANET in 1998 and wish the organisers every success.

The Directory of Planning Schools consists of three parts. The first part provides a brief description of planning and AESOP activities. It describes AESOP's origins and aims, and presents its decision-making and organisational structure. The Association's Charter, signed in 1992, is included.

The second part is the main body of the Directory consisting of individual reports on the planning schools. This is organised alphabetically by country. All the information for this section was provided by the schools themselves. Those schools that have not provided us with updated information since the last edition in 1998 are placed at the end of each country section. For this third edition of the Directory we have included website addresses and the research interests of each school. The schools' web addresses are linked to the AESOP website at <http://www.ncl.ac.uk/aesop>. AESOP affiliate and individual members are also listed.

The last part includes an appendix containing the names of key planning academics in Europe. They are listed alphabetically with their school affiliation and e-mail address where known.

I hope this publication enables you to network more effectively with other planning schools in research and education and to promote further the development of our challenging and stimulating discipline.

About AESOP

What is planning?

The question "What is planning?" is easier to raise than to answer. With a slight exaggeration it could be said that there are as many definitions as there are planners. Still the question is relevant, not least due to the fact that the word "planning" sometimes is used in a context which gives rise to negative associations. In the former communist countries in East Europe the word "planning" was used by the regimes as a mean for fulfilling politically decided goals for development in various sectors of society. In many of the Western countries, "planning" previously was seen as an activity whereby the state, in a centralised and insensitive manner, provided housing, infrastructure, work places, culture and social services to the citizens in the country.

To AESOP the word "planning" has a different meaning. To us planning is a tool to promote and manage change with a spatial approach. It is also a tool for preservation of the environment and our cultural heritage. The core of this task is to conduct planning activities in such a way that society benefits and that economic, environmental, social and other goals are met.

The challenge for planning lies in the fact that various interests and expectations for the future often hold contradiction and conflict. A professional approach combining sensitivity and analytical and strategically skills is required to handle the political, social, environmental and economic issues at stake.

In view of these underlying conflicts of interest, AESOP recognises three aspects which must be given priority in planning and planning education; knowledge, analytical and interactive methods and ethics.

- *Knowledge* relates to the subjects that are dealt with in planning, i. e. urban and regional development, housing, social welfare, transportation and other types of infrastructure provision.
- *Analytical and interactive methods* include the ability to make observations, define problems and apply suitable methods for analysing and solving the problems defined. The role of planning is ultimately to formulate plans that meet the economic, environmental, social and physical needs of society. The task is also to suggest strategies needed to implement these plans. This work must be carried out with recognition of conflicts in interest. Skills in conflict handling, negotiations and mediation are therefore of vital importance.
- *Ethics* are an essential part of planning as suggested solutions should promote important values such as equity, social justice, efficiency and possibilities for the affected interest groups and the public to participate in the process preceding decision making.

Planning is an interdisciplinary activity. AESOP has members with different professional backgrounds, for example architecture, civil engineering, social

sciences, land surveying and law. It also holds true that approaches to planning vary somewhat within Europe as well as in other parts of the world. These differences relate to culture, traditions, attitudes, political decisions and the economic situation in the countries. A key task for AESOP is to facilitate a dialogue among planners with different backgrounds and perspectives.

Challenges for the 21st century

Today we can see an increasing enthusiasm for planning. It is becoming more and more obvious that development within different fields of society are closely interrelated. In order to achieve efficient solutions, development of transportation systems, economic development and housing and services must be co-ordinated. Development through particular projects has proven to be problematic. A satisfying result can normally not be achieved without a more holistic approach and a strategy which recognises interrelations and total effects in a long term perspective. This in turn leads to the need for spatial co-ordination.

Yet another reason for the increased interest in planning lies in partial market failure. The 1980's proved that the market often cannot provide effective solutions to various needs of infrastructure and other common services. The shortcomings of the market are also reflected in demands for planning in order to establish a stable framework for decision making in urban and regional development.

Besides these arguments for planning we observe changes in society that require planning and the development of new approaches and methods. In the AESOP statement "The State of Planning in Europe" four key tendencies with respect to urban and regional change are identified. These changes call for rethinking and the development of planning. The challenge for planning and planners lies in the development of effective analytical tools and methods for addressing the issues in an effective way. The issues are:

- the impact of both the globalising economy and the policies of the EU
- the search for ways of managing our economic and social activities which also can reach the objectives of environmental sustainability
- the social consequences of high levels of unemployment, increasing social inequalities, and migration across Europe
- the search for ways of reducing public expenditure and developing less bureaucratic and more collaborative ways of undertaking the work of urban governance
- to promote continuous professional development

AESOP - Objectives

AESOP has the following objectives:

- to **represent the interest of planning schools** in Europe in national and international administrations and organisations, particularly within Europe
- to promote the development of **teaching and research** in the field of **planning**
- to facilitate **co-operation and exchange between planning schools** in Europe, and to encourage the **harmonisation and equivalence** of their degrees
- to **articulate a European dimension within planning education** as part of the process of institutional co-operation and integration within Europe, bearing in mind also the prospect of increasing professional mobility within Europe
- to **foster and enrich higher education in planning** across Europe by mutual support, including facilitating dialogue, exchange visits and the spread of information
- to defend the cause of **expanding and enhancing higher education in planning** and
- to **promote a progressive approach to planning education** in schools of planning by experts with a rounded view against rival claims from older-established academic units and from other disciplines and professions

Formal status

Since May 1992 AESOP has been registered under Belgian law as a non-profit association. Our registered address **for legal purposes** is:

AESOP Activities

Congresses

The key event of AESOP is the Annual Congress which brings together staff and students from the broad spectrum of work of member schools. It incorporates presentations and discussions of papers on planning, planning-related and planning-education subjects. Congresses also include local study visits, business-meetings and meetings of special interest groups. The congress is normally held in the summer (June-August). It usually takes place from Wednesday or Thursday until Saturday followed by optional participation in a post congress tour lasting for two or three days.

Seminars

In addition to the annual congress AESOP has decided to, arrange an annual seminar. The Seminar will have a clear theme, an informal workshop style, focus in depth on a topic, be limited in size and be relevant to AESOP's concerns with developing understanding and education in the planning field within Europe.

Seminars can be based on any of the three following areas:

- an issue-based Seminar
- a Seminar focused on the development of some aspect of the planning curricula
- a Seminar focused on the interface between Education Policy and Practice

The first Seminar, a joint venture with ISOCARP, was held in Ascona, Switzerland in April 1997. This seminar theme was Planning for the Third Millennium - From Knowledge to Action. The seminar was based on in depth discussions about the interactions between planning education, research and practice. Special focus was directed to questions regarding the need for new skills for planners, from both an academic and practitioner perspective.

Members are encouraged to come forward with ideas for future seminars.

Working groups

AESOP currently has three working groups generously supported by the European Commission DG XX11/A2 as part of the Socrates research initiative to extend a Thematic Network Programme across European Planning Schools.

(i) The Working Group on Planning Research (WGPR), is exploring the development of **urban and territorial research within European Planning Schools** and the potential for joint research directions on the perspective of **European integration**. The WGPR is coordinated by Prof. Alessandro

Balducci at Dipartimento di Scienze del Territorio, Politecnico di Milano, Milan (Italy).

(ii) The Working Group on PhD (WGPhD), has looked at the **development of doctoral studies research programmes** and at improving joint initiatives in the exchange of students and research orientations. The WGPhD is coordinated by Prof. Barry Needham at the Faculteit der Beleidswetenschappen, Vakgroep Planologie, Katholieke Universiteit Nijmegen, Nijmegen (the Netherlands).

(iii) The Working Group on Education/Professional links (WGEP), aiming at exploring how spatial planning education within universities may improve and serve the needs of **professional planning practice**. The WGEP is coordinated by Prof. Taner Ocat the Institute of Urban Planning, School of the Built Environment, University of Nottingham, United Kingdom.

PhD Workshops

Doctoral Workshops were initiated in 1993 and 10 have been held so far. The main objectives of the Workshops are to bring young researchers in the planning field together to develop their capacity to exchange ideas among European scholars and to get to know the different intellectual and practice cultures of the various countries within AESOP. The Workshops centre around papers by the participants, with sessions by leading academics in the field of planning. The Workshops are held in conjunction with the annual congresses.

AESOP Newsletter

The AESOP Newsletter also gives news of our corporate activities and of the activities of members. There are, in addition, reviews of publications likely to be of interest to members. Announcements appear about forthcoming conferences, elections, publications etc. Major decisions made at the Executive Committee and the Council of Representatives are reported. Topical articles appear on aspects of planning education in various countries of Europe and beyond. At present Basil Dimitriou, School of Planning, Oxford Brookes University, UK is editor of the AESOP Newsletter.

European Planning Studies

The journal *European Planning Studies* is published in co-operation with AESOP. It provides a forum for ideas and information about spatial development processes and policies in Europe. The journal publishes articles of a theoretical, empirical and policy-relevant nature and is particularly concerned to integrate knowledge of processes with practical policy proposals, implementation and evaluation. Within the scope of the journal, manuscripts dealing with country-specific, region-specific or locality-specific issues are especially welcome, as well as comparative analyses, case studies of successful spatial policies and critiques of policy failure based on in-depth study.

Organisation and administration

AESOP has three decision making bodies: the General Assembly; the Council of Representatives and the Executive Committee.

General Assembly

The General Assembly takes place once a year in conjunction with the Annual Congress. It is an opportunity for all members to meet and address issues of importance to planning. At the General Assembly the President also reports on the year's activities and members' opinions are sought on various issues and matters.

Council of Representatives

The main policy and decision making body in AESOP is the Council of Representatives.

The full member schools in each country choose National Representatives to represent them as a group in the Council of Representatives. The Council has at the moment [43] members and meets twice a year. One meeting takes place during the annual congress and the other in midwinter.

The Council of Representatives also elects the office-bearers who form the Executive Committee of AESOP.

Executive Committee

Under the leadership of the President assisted by two Vice-Presidents the Executive Committee operates with delegated powers on behalf of the Council and is subject to its authority. The Executive Committee meets twice yearly. In these meetings, the Executive generally tries to plan for the needs and wishes of the membership and to implement the policies of AESOP as expressed in the General Assembly or by the Council of Representatives.

Usually persons elected as office-bearers hold office for a period of two years, starting from the time of the Annual Congress. The exceptions relate to Past Presidents, who hold an honorary position for five years, and the Senior Vice President who is elected for one year.

Finance and day-to-day administration

The financial resources of AESOP derive primarily from membership subscriptions, so it is crucial to our efficient operation and continued survival that members arrange for prompt payment of these on receipt of a reminder from the Treasurer at the start of each calendar year.

Day-to-day administrative affairs are handled by the Secretary General and monetary transactions by the Treasurer. Within that general schema, however, all office-bearers are allocated specific tasks. These include co-operation with other planning oriented organisations and other international bodies, and promotion of our corporate interests through interaction with such organisations.

Membership

AESOP membership has grown dramatically over time. At present (July 2001) we have 172 members in more than 35 countries. Most of the prominent planning schools in Europe are members, and more and more key schools and persons in the world of planning are deciding to join. Also wishing to associate themselves with our aims and activities are a number of enlightened organisations concerned with planning aspects of government, property and development.

There are five categories of membership in AESOP. They are described below:

- **Full membership.** The core membership consists of planning schools within institutions of higher education in Europe. Eligible for full membership is a school or similar unit within an institution of higher education, with permanent staff of planning-educators; planning course(s) to degree level, of at least two years duration; planning research expected as well as links with other planning schools. The Full Members hold voting rights and hence, through their representatives, chiefly determine AESOP policies and procedures.

Besides Full Membership, four other categories of membership exists. Though these members do not have voting rights, they are eligible to receive our various publications and to participate fully in all our substantive activities such as the Annual Congress, Seminars and Working Groups. Their support and opinions are genuinely appreciated.

- **Associate membership.** A school within Europe where some teaching of planning occurs, usually as a specialism within a course, for example social sciences, geography or architecture, may become an Associate Member.
- **Corresponding membership.** A planning school located outside of Europe (as defined by the United Nations) may become a Corresponding Member.
- **Affiliate membership.** An organisation with a genuine interest in planning, which wishes to support us in our aims may become an Affiliate Member.
- **Individual membership.** An individual who is interested in planning and planning education may join as an Individual Member.

The AESOP Charter

DECREE

Article 1

The international association " Association of European Schools of Planning" is hereby granted formal recognition as a legal persona. Its registered address shall be:

Article 2

The charter of the above mentioned association, appended to the present decree, is hereby approved.

Article 3

Our minister of Justice shall be responsible for the execution of the present decree.

INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF EUROPEAN SCHOOLS OF
PLANNING CHARTER
(as published in the "Moniteur Belgique" 1992)

1. DESTINATION

Article 1

An international association, to be called the Association of European Schools of Planning, or AESOP for short, is hereby established as an international association with a scientific, artistic and educational purpose. This association is subject to the Belgian Act of 25 October 1919 as amended by the Act of 6 December 1954.

2. AIMS

Article 2

This non-profit Association shall have the aims of:

- a) promoting within Europe the development of teaching and research in the field of planning;
- b) instigating co-operation and exchanges between planning schools in Europe, and encouraging the harmonisation and equivalence of degrees which they award, and
- c) representing the interest of planning schools in Europe in national and international administrations and organisations, particularly within Europe.

Article 3

In relation to this charter, the following definitions shall apply:

- a) "School" refers to any school, department, centre of teaching and research or other teaching entity which grants university degree or other equivalent awards.
- b) "Europe" and "European" refers to those countries outside North America which compose the Economic Commission for Europe of the United Nations Social and Economic Council.
- c) "Planning" includes strategic planning (both urban and rural) on both regional and local scales, and environmental management.

3. REGISTERED ADDRESS

Article 4

The registered address of the Association shall be recorded as Celestijnenlaan 131, 3001 Leuven Heverlee, Belgium. This can be transferred to any other place in Belgium by a simple resolution of the Executive, published in the Annexes du Moniteur Belgique within one month of date when so resolved.

4. MEMBERS

Article 5

The Association shall consist of individual persons. Each school shall be represented in the Association by the individual contact persons it has nominated.

Article 6

- a) There shall be four categories of membership, that is to say:
 - 1) Full Member
 - 2) Associate Member
 - 3) Affiliate Member
 - 4) Individual Member
- b) Each Full Member shall belong to the academic personnel of a European planning school, viz: nominated contact person of that school, and one of those nominated to the Council or elected to the Executive.
- c) Each Associate Member shall represent a non-European planning school or a school directly concerned with planning
- d) Each Affiliate Member shall represent a firm, organisation or agency directly concerned with planning
- e) Each Individual Member shall be a person actively engaged in planning.

Article 7

- a) The Executive (as defined in Articles 11, 21-23) shall determine applications for membership and their appropriate categorisation.
- b) In certain circumstances, the Executive may grant temporary Full Member status to an Associate Member.
- c) the applicant may appeal to the Council (as defined in Articles 11, 15-20) against the Executive's decision.
- d) Persons nominated to the Council or elected to the Executive will through their acceptance of this role become a Full Member if not already so.

Article 8

- a) A member may resign by notifying the Secretary General in writing.
- b) The Council shall have the power to expel any member where serious grounds exists for doing so. A two third majority vote is required to effect this.

5. RIGHTS AND DUTIES

Article 9

Members shall have the following rights:

- a) to attend meetings of the Association and to participate in its business;
- b) to participate in its activities; and
- c) to receive its publications

Article 10

Members shall have the following duties:

- a) to notify the Association of changes of circumstances that might affect their appropriate membership category; and
- b) to pay all fees that the Council requires.

6. ADMINISTRATION

Article 11

The administrative and managerial organs of the Association shall be:

- 1) the full Assembly, alias the assembly
- 2) the Council of Representatives, alias the Council
- 3) the Executive Committee, alias the Executive

Article 12

- a) The Assembly shall be the Association's formal means of consultation.
- b) The Assembly shall consider the policy and administration of the Association on the basis of reports presented by the Council of Representatives.
- c) The Assembly shall discuss planning education and research in relation to themes proposed by the Council

Article 13

The Assembly shall be open to every category of member and also to lectures, researchers and students from schools represented in the Association.

Article 14

- a) For the Assembly a quorum shall be at least 15 Full Members and must include at least three members of the Executive and at least three other members of the Council of Representatives.
- b) The Assembly shall be chaired by the President.

COUNCIL

Article 15

- a) All the Association's powers shall rest with the Council.
- b) The management and administration of the Association shall be delegated to the Executive but are always under the ultimate control of the Council.
- c) The functions exclusive to the Council are as follows:
 - 1) definition of policies and programmes of the Association;
 - 2) expulsion of any members, appeals on membership applications, and disputes between any members of the Executive;
 - 3) election and termination of office of Officials;
 - 4) establishment of internal rules and of the level of membership subscriptions;

- 5) allocation of prizes in the field of planning; and
- 6) modification of the Association's rules and its dissolution.

Article 16

- a) The Council shall be composed of the following members:
 - 1) the national representatives;
 - 2) the Officials; and
 - 3) up to three additional persons designated by the President
- b) Where a country has one Full Member, it shall represent that country. Where a country has two Full Members, both shall represent that country. Where a country has more than two Full Members, all Full Members of that country shall organise an election of two representatives. The Secretary General shall be responsible for the general oversight of this process.
- c) The President can designate persons only from the European planning schools represented within the Association.

Article 17

- a) Any member of the Council may resign by written notification to the Secretary General.
- b) The Council can expel any member by a two thirds majority vote.
- c) When a position becomes vacant, arrangements can be made to fill the post for the remainder of the mandatory period in accordance with Article 16.

Article 18

Each Council so formed shall last for two years.

Article 19

- a) The Council shall meet at least once annually on the call of the President.
- b) Special meeting of the Council shall be called by the President on the request of at least five of its members.
- c) The Secretary General shall inform Council members of the agenda, date, time and place of each meeting at least two weeks in advance.

Article 20

- a) The quorum of the Council shall be at least seven members, including at least three Officials of the Association and three others from amongst the national representatives.
- b) Members of the Council can designate another members proxy in their absence. No member can be proxy for than two persons. In calculating the quorum, any proxy must be disregarded.
- c) The Council shall be chaired by the President.
- d) Resolutions shall be carried on a simple majority, except in those special cases stipulated in this constitution. Where voting is evenly split, the President shall have the casting vote.
- e) The Council's resolutions shall be recorded in a register signed by the President and any other Official, and be available from the Secretary General for inspection by Full Members.

EXECUTIVE

Article 21

- a) The Executive shall hold the managerial and administrative powers of the Association, by delegation from the Council who are the sole ultimate authority.
- b) Day to day management can be delegated to the President and the Secretary General.
- c) In addition, special specified powers can be conferred on one or more persons.
- d) All undertakings by the Association must be signed by the President and one of other Officials. The President can designate the Treasurer or Secretary General as her/his proxy. The signatories shall not have to justify to third parties the powers given to them for this purpose.
- e) In between the Executive meetings, the President shall be in charge of current business and shall keep the Executive informed.

Article 22

- a) The members of the Executive are the Officials of the Association.
- b) Every Official shall be a person on the teaching staff of a European planning school represented in the Association.

- c) At least one of the Officials shall be of Belgian Nationality.

Article 23

- a) The Officials of the Association shall be elected by the Council.
- b) An Official can be relieved of her/his functions by notification in writing from the Secretary General. This termination applies from the date when a replacement takes effect.
- c) In case of removal from office or incapacity, the Executive Committee may appoint up to two temporary Officials for the remaining period of office. For more than two, the Council shall elect a new Executive.
- d) On expiry of their period of office, the President and the Vice President shall not be eligible for re-election; while other Officials are eligible for re-election only once more.
- e) The Officials shall hold office for two years, with the exception of the Senior Vice President whose period of office shall last for only one year.
- f) By a two thirds majority, the Council may remove any Official from office. Where a member from the Association becomes expelled, this implies also removal from any office held as an Official.

Article 24

- a) At minimum, the Executive shall consist of:
 - 1) a President
 - 2) a Senior Vice President
 - 3) a Vice President
 - 4) a Secretary General
 - 5) a Treasurer
- b) Should the President be prevented from carrying out her/his duties for whatever reason, he/she shall be replaced by another Official in accordance with the precedence expressed above.
- c) The Council shall stipulate in its internal rules the exact duties of each Official.

Article 25

- a) The Executive shall meet at least twice annually on the call of either the President or at least three other Officials.
- b) The quorum for Executive meetings shall be four members.
- c) An Official may designate another Official as her/his proxy. No single Official can act as proxy for more than one other Official. In calculating the quorum, proxies must be disregarded.
- d) The Executive shall be chaired by the President.

Article 26

- a) The resolutions of the Executive shall be carried on a simple majority vote. On a split vote, the President's vote shall be decisive
- b) The resolution of the Executive shall be recorded in a register signed by the President and a Second Official. The register shall be in the custody of the Secretary General who on request shall make it available for inspection to members of the Council.

Article 27

Judicial actions, whether initiated or being defended by AESOP, whether passive or active, shall be the responsibility of the President or an Official appointed by her/him for the purpose.

7. BUDGET AND ACCOUNTS

Article 28

- a) The accounting year shall end on 31 July
- b) The Executive shall have a duty to submit an annual financial report for the Council's approval.
- c) The Council may determine the nature of any assets or reserve fund.

8. EXTINCTION OF MEMBERS' RIGHTS

Article 29

- a) Any member who ceases to participate in the Association, whether through death or otherwise, shall have no remaining rights relating to assets and funds of the Association.

- b) The obligations of any member at the termination date shall remain.
- c) The party replacing a Full Member, Associate Member or Affiliate Member shall take on the rights and duties of the member being replaced.

9. MODIFICATIONS OF CONSTITUTION, DISSOLUTION

Article 30

- a) Without prejudice to Article 3 of the Act of 25 October 1919, any proposal for modifying the constitution of AESOP or of dissolving the Association must emanate from the Executive or from at least half of the total number of Council members.
- b) The Secretary General must communicate in writing to each Full Member, at least six weeks in advance, the content of any such proposal and the date of the Council meeting at which the said proposal will be considered.
- c) Any Council meeting attended by less than two thirds of its membership cannot validly deliberate on such proposals for modification or dissolution. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the Council meets and fewer than two thirds of the membership attend, a fresh meeting can be convened, on the same conditions as above, and it shall deliberate definitely and legitimately on the proposal concerned, whatever the number attending or represented.
- d) A two-thirds majority vote is required for any such decision to be taken.
- e) The Council shall decide upon the manner of dissolution of the Association and the final settlement of its accounts.

10. GENERAL ARRANGEMENTS

Article 31

All matters not covered in this constitution and particularly in the notices to be published in the Annexes du Moniteur Belgique shall be regulated in conformity to the provisions of the law.

The curriculum of the Magistère Aménagement includes about 2000 hours of classes and workshops during the three years period, plus study visits and journeys, plus one or two periods of professional training, plus two dissertations.

The program of classes include 42 courses of 36 hours each, concerning :

- Physical aspects of planning, including study of the natural environment
- Studies of human settlements (urban and rural)
- Theories and history of architecture and planning
- Institutional aspects of planning (actors of planning, juridical aspects, management, etc.)
- Economic and financial aspects of planning
- Techniques : cartography, statistics, computer science, remote

- sensing, demography, means and methods of communication
- Specialised courses (housing, transportation, water resources, protection of heritage, protection of the environment, etc.)
- Operational planning

The workshops are case studies. During the third year, groups of 4 to 8 students (under the responsibility of academic staff) develop an actual case study of professional level for a public or private body (often a local authority) and produce a planning study with a contract from this institution.

The students attend during the three years program numerous field visits, including one study journey abroad each year. In 2000, the countries visited were Great Britain, Netherlands and Viêt-Nam.

The DEA "Aménagement, Urbanisme et Dynamique des Espaces" program (attended by students outside Magistère and few 3rd year Magistère students) include 250 hours of research oriented courses. Students who have no previous education in the field of planning attend simultaneously a complementary program in planning.
