FOREWORD

Welcome to Aveiro, to the University of Aveiro, and to the XII AESOP Congress.

This booklet contains information about the organisation of the conference, the scientific programme, AESOP meetings and workshops, social events and tourist information, which will help you to organise your time at the conference and your stay in Aveiro. All sessions are held at the Campus of the University of Aveiro. The Secretariat is located on the ground-floor of the Department of Environment and Planning. The Opening and Closing Sessions will also take place in the auditorium of the Department.

We received submissions for more than 200 papers under the Congress Theme 'Planning, Professionals and Public Expectations' and the suggested related subjects for topic and free sessions. With such a large number of abstracts with an innovative and diversified content we had to make a few adjustments in the allocation of papers by thematic sessions and to create appropriate titles for some of the sessions. The number of Thematic Sessions is now 15. We hope this distribution will satisfy all participants and will produce, in the different parallel sessions, interesting and stimulating debates.

In the opening Plenary Session, John Forester will give a talk on 'Reflections on the Future of Planning Practice'. In the closing Plenary Session we will discuss challenges for planning under three different perspectives: the local level, with the Mayor of Aveiro, the regional/national level, with the Secretary of State for Regional Planning, Portugal, and the supra-national level, with a representative of the European Commission, DG XVI, Brussels. The Congress will also provide the opportunity to discuss the AESOP Socrates Project, initially in separate working groups and, eventually, in a plenary session.

In the first day there will be a 'city walk' to provide a better acquaintance with the host town. In the evening, the welcome reception will take place at the Town Museum, where participants will hear about the town and its history. On Friday, after the Closing Session, the Congress Dinner will take place at the University Campus. Finally, the study tours will allow the opportunity to know more about Portugal and the contemporary planning ideas, practice, and challenges. The EXPO 98 in Lisbon, the last world exposition of this Century, can then be visited by those who are interested.

We hope you have an enjoyable time in Aveiro and a productive and stimulating Congress.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND EVENTS

Congress Venue

The Congress is held at the Campus of the University of Aveiro. The map included in this booklet indicates the location of the buildings and facilities where the sessions and the different events take place. The Secretariat and Registration Desk are located on the ground-floor of the Department of Environment and Planning. The Opening and Closing Sessions will also take place in the auditorium of the Department.

Registration

Registration will take place on Wednesday 22 July between 8.30 and 18.00 and will continue on Thursday and Friday. The Congress Desk will deal with registration procedures and will be the information centre of the Congress. The Congress Travel Agency, Culturalia, has a permanent desk for dealing with hotel reservations, social programme for accompanying persons, visits to the Expo 98 in Lisbon and other tourist information.

City Walk in Aveiro

The City-Walk has two objectives - to give to the visitors references for enjoying the town during their stay, and to provide a knowledge about planning in Aveiro. We will try to give you an overview of the present planning opportunities and problems, by talking about the relevant stages of its development process and present day urban planning challenges. The meeting point for the 'city walkers' is the 'Museu de Aveiro - Princesa Santa Joana' (the Aveiro Museum) located in front of the 'Sé' (the Cathedral). Hotels will give you the information on how to get there. The idea is to guide the visitors along one of the 'main axis' of the old settlement (Rua Direita), through the 'city centre', to the square in front of the City Hall (Praça de Republica). From this square we can see a row of notable 'Art Nouveaux' houses, located along one of the city's main canals. We will then take you to the top of the city's tallest building (Centro Regional Segurança Social) for an overview of the town and its surrounding areas including the lagoon (Ria). The tour will continue to the Museum of Aveiro where a welcome reception will be waiting for the visitors.

Welcome Reception

The welcome reception will take place at 18.30 on Wednesday the 22nd of July, in the Town Museum. Participants will hear about the town and its history in the cloister of the Museum where drinks will be served.

Congress Dinner

The Congress Dinner will be held after the Closing Session, at 20.30 on Friday, at the University Campus. The menu will be based on regional gastronomic specialities. Re-

Visit to the Expo 98 in Lisbon

In addition to the conference, an excursion to the site of the world exposition - Expo 1998 - in Lisbon, was organised on Sunday 26th. The central theme of the Expo 98 is 'The Oceans, a Heritage for the Future'. With this theme Expo has secured the largest number of participating countries of any other world fair. A particular feature of the event is the redevelopment of 340 hectares of industrial disused land in Lisbon's eastern harbour. Purposely designed pavilions and facilities in the 60 hectares of the centrally located Expo site, such as an exhibition centre, a stadium and an aquarium, will be integrated after Expo into a new service, business and residential quarter for Easter Lisbon, served by a new metro line and railway station, the 'Gare do Oriente'.

STUDY TOUR 2 - THE RIA

The "Ria de Aveiro" is one of the most important wetland areas in the northern part of Portugal, extremely sensitive in its environmental balance. The "Ria" is a complex system where three rivers (Vouga, Boco and Agueda) join with sea water. It is approximately 45km long and 8.5km wide, covering about 11,000ha. It includes a Natural Reserve ("Reserva Natural de S.Jacinto") covering approximately 700ha and 20 Corine sites, and it was integrated in the first proposals of sites for Natura 2000.

The area and its surroundings are suffering from serious development pressures ranging from agricultural, industrial, tourism and urban sectors. It is integrated in a complex structure of institutional jurisdiction, involving 10 municipalities and several regional and central government departments. These features have hindered the definition of global development and strategic quality objectives as well as the adoption of adequate integrated planning and management strategies.

The objective of this study-tour is to give a global view of the environmental sensitivity of the area and major examples of development pressures and related impacts. The tour will focus on issues of urban spread, industrial location and transport infrastructures.

The tour will be by bus. Lunch is included

STUDY TOUR 1 - THE CITY OF AVEIRO

This study-tour will be based on a game(*) which (hopefully) will allow the opportunity of knowing and understanding the most important aspects of sociocultural, economic, urban and architectural developments in Aveiro.

(*) - a 'Rally Paper' (on foot) through the town, involving 'competing teams' of three people / each team will be formed by three experts of different disciplinary areas and backgrounds (from whom, all of us, are expecting, important scientific achievements and useful planning proposals as well a pleasant and amusing day); there will be a bus for the ones who are not fond of walking.

We will use the opportunity of having foreign planning expertise in Aveiro to promote the participants interests and capacity for an evaluation of different aspects of the urban and built environment. The objective is to produce a 'draft of planning strategic initiatives or works' for a more sustainable future of Aveiro and a more pleasant daily life for its inhabitants and visitors.

Since this study-tour is a 'game', rewards will be offered.

The most daring participants can also try ('and evaluate') local delicacies, which should be ask for in particular places, by speaking Portuguese.

Considering the above, the ones who intend to be 'walking participants' of this study-tour, should bring comfortable shoes and good humour.

STUDY TOUR 3 - COASTAL AREA AND THE NATURAL RESERVE

Aveiro's coastal region belongs to the littoral plain which expands to the south of the Douro river and it is occupied by the lagoon's wet zone.

In 1920 a forestry policy was promoted in order to fix the sand dunes and by this way to prevent the invasion of inner agricultural soils. That afforested area creates a buffer zone for the development of tourist settlements on the coastal area, spreading, at the same time, the leisure into dune areas throughout the network of forestry roads.

In the "Ria de Aveiro" lagoon system we can identify numerous types of habitats. That originates conditions for the presence of a large number of species. Some species of fauna present a high interest for conservation which are mentioned on the Habitats Directive annexes.

In spite of the recognition of the natural value of the region only a small area has a protected status, the Dunes Natural Reserve of S. Jacinto with 660 ha, mainly due to the richness of dune vegetation, liquenes and the presence of a large number of birds inside the reserve area.

The objective of the study-tour is to offer a general overview on the harbour location and development, on the use of the salt-marshes lagoon channels and on the coastal use of the northern sand barrier and nature reserve.

The study-tour will take place on a traditional boat and include a walking trip. Comfortable shoes and a hat are convenient. Lunch is included

STUDY TOUR 4 - THE HISTORIC CENTRE OF PORTO

Porto has its medieval historic centre rather preserved, but very damaged by the impact of the industrial revolution, and by the housing policies of the fascist regime (before 1974). With a population of 15,000 inhabitants in 90 ha, the historic centre was built close to the ancient harbour, facing the port wine cellars, on the other bank of the Douro. Since 1974 the area is being renewed, with the preservation of families in their neighbourhoods. This operation, lead by the municipality, has its own board in the area (the CRUARB). This office promotes an integrated intervention, refurbishing buildings, revitalising activities and renovating public spaces and social facilities.

In 1991, a Foundation for the Development of the area was created by the government and the Porto municipality. In 1994, the European Community provided funds for an important operation in the area, the Urban Pilot Project of Sé. In 1996, UNESCO inscribed the medieval town in the World Heritage List.

The objective of the tour is to visit the area, to know the works which are taking place, the teams, the projects for the future and the planning which is being done.

A trip by bus to Porto will be followed by a walking visit in the area. Lunch is included.

STUDY TOUR 5 - THE CITY OF COIMBRA

Coimbra, with about 100,000 inhabitants, is a town of long-standing university traditions and constitutes the main tertiary centre of the Centro region of Portugal. The town occupies an area of hilly topography. The growth that occurred in the decades of 1970 and 1980 resulted in serious spatial conflicts associated with built densities and a problematic relationship between the urban fabric and its natural support, which represent a challenge for the planning exercise of Coimbra.

The study tour will include a visit to the following sites:

- a high point overlooking the city (Penedo da Saudade);
- the historic centre, with the remains of the original city (ALTA) and the downtown commercial centre (BAIXA), based on the medieval urban structure, where the main street (Rua da Sofia) and the Renaissance colleges are points of reference. The recent policy of pedestrianisation combined with the renewal of some old monuments and incentives for commercial redevelopment has produced a quite liveable space and positive externalities which has visible effects in the modernisation of a significant part of the area.
- the University (Polo1) located in the top of ALTA, which is the site of the old university, occupies the ancient Royal Palace and an expansion undertaken by the dictatorial regime in the first half of this century through a process of massive demolition.
- the Mondego river which was recently regularised and offers now opportunities for the development of its banks. The conception of a river front with high natural and urban quality is being planned. The municipality has several projects, with the objective of "Strengthening the City Centre, Centring the City around the River". We will visit the area and we will have a brief insight on the concepts that are behind these interventions.

A bus trip will take the participants to Coimbra. The city walking can be a little hard. Therefore, comfortable shoes and some strength are convenient. Lunch is included.
