

AESOP


As President of the Association of European Schools of Planning I would like to warmly welcome all the participants to the third ACSP-AESOP Joint Congress. We are crossing a particularly hard period in international relations: the strong commitment for building a community of thought without boundaries, as a means to contribute to the welfare of our societies, basis of our associations, has been threatened by the tragedy of September the 11th 2001, the divisions upon the measures to prevent terrorism, and especially upon last war in Iraq. Even the recent Sars disease has attacked the basic mechanisms of exchange: the free circulation of people. But it is exactly in these more difficult times that we are called to re-state clearly the reasons of our common work, just to make clear that it is not an academic rite but the way in which we take our responsibility as educators, scholars and practitioners in planning.

It is in these more difficult times that we have to look backward to the origins of the planning movement, to the work of founders like Howard, Geddes and Mumford whose main concern was to help communities to grow better, giving shape to places capable of integrating individuals and groups during the industrial era. And we have to look forward to the challenges that arise from fragmentation processes and from the new inequalities that undermine the cohesion of our societies today. Working on the relationship between space and society planning is deeply involved in a process of "territorial reconstruction" that is aimed, in a completely new economic, social and political environment, at the production of places that could integrate individuals and groups in a globalising world. Just today we need therefore to increase the opportunities of exchange and this is particularly true among planning traditions and societies that share common roots but experience at the same time common problems and different strategies to cope with them.

The richness of the Congress programme will allow us to focus upon planning and education issues taking advantage from the varieties of our perspectives. It has been carefully prepared by a joint Organising Committee that I personally want to thank for the professional capacity and for being able to direct every effort to the scientific value of the event.

But we also have to think that relations between AESOP and ACSP have been the engine for the creation of the broader network among planning schools that has led to the Shanghai Congress in 2001 and will hopefully lead to the second global initiative in 2006.

This Congress will be very important also from this perspective and I want to welcome all the participants from other schools and associations with whom we want to share a conception of a global exchange that is respectful of cultural differences and committed to the free circulation of knowledge as a means to develop a peaceful and better world.

ACSP

As president of the Association of Collegiate Schools of Planning, I am thrilled to welcome you to the third joint ACSP-AESOP Congress. Building on the success of Oxford in 1991 and Toronto in 1996, I'm sure this year's event will be wonderfully stimulating.

The world now is vastly different from the one we knew in 1991. European unity was underway then, but was still only tentative, and overshadowed by the division of the continent because of the Cold War. Now, "Europe" is vastly larger, and much closer to similarity with the United States as a "United States of Europe". For our European colleagues, then, your internal collaboration and integration no doubt is much more important, more advanced, and taking more of your time and energy than trans-Atlantic relations.

An ACSP-AESOP Congress that still seemed like a bold venture into globalism a dozen years ago, now almost seems too exclusive, and requires some justification in its geographic limitation. The World Planning Schools Congress two years ago in Shanghai set a new standard for internationalism, and indeed transnationalism. Future years will no doubt see an increase in these broader projects.

Nevertheless, a European-North American conference still is useful. These are the only post-industrial societies, with the most widespread democratic political traditions. While our systems of property rights and government intervention differ considerably, there are large similarities in the problems we face, the solutions that are possible, the resources we have, and the political, economic, and philosophical traditions on which we draw. We have not yet come even close to exhausting what we can learn from each other, the benefits we could reap from comparative and transnational analyses, and the understanding we could achieve about what policies work under what circumstances.

At the same time, both of our organisations continue to be very active in expanding our involvement with planning worldwide. ACSP established a "Planning Globally" Task Force that has been analysing U.S. planning curricula for the best ways to increase global awareness; identifying successful transnational research and study programmes; and participating in the Global Planning Education Associations Network, including its plans for a "Best Papers Biannual" and the next global planning conference in 2006. Through the Planning Accreditation Board, we have also assisted planning organisations throughout the world develop programme and accreditation standards.

As we continue in all of these activities, we are obviously forging stronger and stronger networks. We are increasingly creating a global civic society. Building and maintaining those bonds is important at all levels: in our own institutions, where too often we don't know what our colleagues are doing, in our own country and continent—a task that has still only just begun in Europe; transatlantically, building on the strong ties and similarities between our societies; and globally. Each level matters; I look forward to our network building here in Leuven!

Content

The Ghent Canal-Area, one of the Belgian ports, struggles with important problems and challenges, with strong and different interest groups and with conflicts. The classical planning instruments neither the given formal institutional settings are able to tackle the situation.

In 1993 an integrated planning and decision making process was started for the area stimulated by the province of East-Flanders and sponsored by the European Union. The objective was to solve existing conflict situation and to reach a consensus on key-issues dealing with the possible future of the area. The result of this process up to now, reached by though negotiations between different stakeholders, is a 'strategic plan', in fact an indicative framework concerning the intended long term future of the area and a commitment package of actions on the short term. The 'policy agreement' is used as a main tool in order to realize the package deal. An important effect is the creation of new relations between stakeholders, approaches and tools and even new (informal) governmental structures and bodies. A specific aspect is the democratic dimension of the process and the relation with the population. We will visit the site, discuss the democratic content of the plan and talk with stakeholders. The Ghent case is an example of a planning process, which has been well-received by the authorities, planners and local residents.

8. Congress Guidelines

8.1. Venue

The meetings take place at *College De Valk* (Tiensestraat 41) and at *Hogenheuvecollege* (Naamsestraat 69) in the city centre. Both are at walking distance from each other (10 minutes) and from the hotels. The main building with most rooms and lecture halls is *College De Valk (Falcon College)*. This building consists of two parts: the historic building (Oude Valk/Old Falcon) and a more recent extension (De Nieuwe Valk/New Falcon). The registration and information desk is located in the entrance hall of 'De Nieuwe Valk'

The plenary session on Tuesday July 8, will take place in *Aula Pieter De Somer*, at very close proximity of College De Valk.

The welcome reception takes place in the Jubileum hall of the University Hallen (Cloth Hall), at Naamsestraat 22.

Lunches will be served in the student restaurant *Alma 2* (Van Evenstraat 2), which is also located nearby the colleges (5 to 10 minutes walking from *De Valk* and 5 minutes from *Hogenheuvecollege*). Coffee breaks will be served in both buildings.

See maps in the back of this book for more details and walking routes.

8.2. Language

The working language of the Congress is English.

8.3. Sessions management

For most sessions a moderator and a discussant have been appointed for session management (see schedule by day).

Moderator guidelines

- Arrive at the session room at the latest five minutes prior to the scheduled starting time and introduce yourself to the presenters.
- A room attendant has been appointed to every session room. It is this person's responsibility to take care of the audiovisual equipment and to assist you and the presenters at any time. This room attendant will introduce himself/herself to you at the start.
- Inform presenters of the maximum of time they can use for their paper presentation. This time can vary depending on the number of papers in the session and whether there is a discussant who needs time to respond. Introduce the orange and red card system to them (see further).
- In introducing the session - please be brief - tell the audience how many papers will be presented, how long each presentation will be and when there will be time for questions.
- For each paper, introduce the author and the title of the paper.
- In order to facilitate time management of the presentations, a set of orange and red cards will be at your disposal. Show the orange card to the presenter when 5 minutes presentation time is left. Show the red card when time is over.
- In managing the question-and-answer-time, please ask questioners to identify themselves and to keep their comments as short as possible to allow the presenters to respond in full.
- Please ensure the session to finish in time. Sessions that overrun will affect next sessions.
- In case you are presenting a paper yourself during the session you are chairing, we strongly recommend that this be done at the end of the session, even if this means altering the formal programme slightly. The efficient management of the session will benefit from it. When presenting your paper ask one of the other presenters to manage your time using the cards.

Discussant guidelines

It is the role of the discussant to raise points of discussion from the papers before opening up the discussion to the audience. The review should be brief enabling time for questions and responses.

Presenter guidelines

- Upon arrival at the Congress and after picking up your registration materials, presenters are urged to contact the person at the audiovisual desk. Hand over the CD-Rom or disk with your PowerPoint-presentation or indicate to this person that you will use other presentation means (slides, overhead projection, video, ...).
- Your PowerPoint presentations will be loaded on the PC in the room where you will be presenting and will be ready at the start of the session. PowerPoint presentations that have not been handed over can NOT be installed on the PC of the session room just before the start of the session!
- Remember that connecting to the LCD-projector of the room with your own laptop will not be allowed!
- We encourage you to bring a back-up CD or diskette to the room where you will be presenting.
- Arrive at the session room at the latest five minutes prior to the scheduled starting time. If you are using another type of visual equipment than standard provided (PowerPoint), you are encouraged to be in the room even earlier.
- Introduce yourself to the other presenters and to the moderator and discussant. If no moderator is present for whatever reason, please nominate someone among the presenters to act as the time manager for the session.
- You will be instructed before the session on the length of your presentation. This will inevitably vary between sessions depending on the number of papers to be presented and whether there is a discussant. Usually each speaker will be allowed a maximum of 15 minutes, which means that you will not be able to read your full paper. You therefore need to structure your presentation around key points and arguments. You will not be permitted to speak longer than the allocated time, as this would be unfair to other presenters. The moderator is instructed to intervene by means of a system of coloured cards.
- Within each session some time will be devoted to questions and discussion. There will be many informal opportunities to discuss your ideas with participants at the various social events. So do not feel that you must cram everything into 15 minutes.
- When presenting your paper, be conscious of the considerable variations that exist within the English language. Furthermore, for many of the participants in the Congress, English may not be their first language. When presenting it is important to consider some basic issues:
 - a. Speak slowly and with great clarity, recognizing that individual country or regional accents may make it difficult to be understood by the audience
 - b. Note that if you are using terms that are culturally specific, they may not be readily understood by individuals from other parts of the world. While it is difficult to avoid using technical terms, there is also a responsibility to explain their meaning.In summary, it is important that you present the ideas in your paper in a manner that is accessible to a broad range of cultural background of those attending the Congress.

8.4. Registration & information Desk

The Registration and Information desks are located in the entrance hall of College De Valk (De Nieuwe Valk - concrete building). The desks will be staffed during regular Congress hours. Please contact the desk personnel if you have problems, questions or doubts about the Congress programme, the mobile workshops, the sight seeing tours or any other practical problem related to your stay. They will try to help you further.

8.5. Name badges

Participants are kindly requested to wear their name badge at all times during the Congress. Admittance to social events requires wearing the name badge. Name badges of registered accompanying guests are included in the registration envelope of the participant they accompany.

9. Congress Facilities

9.1. Signposting and finding your way

The buildings where Congress sessions take place will be clearly indicated by signposts between and around buildings.

For easy finding of session rooms within each building, rooms have been named after famous Belgian painters for easier identification. Please consult the 'Schedule by day' to find the name of the session room. Maps of the buildings and floors have been added in the back of this volume. Pedestrian routes have been indicated by a dotted line.

If you really get lost in the maze of K.U.Leuven, do not hesitate to ask assistance from the staff at the information desk or from one of the student helpers. They will be around to help manage the Congress and will be recognizable by their Congress T-shirt.

9.2. Coffee breaks and lunches

Coffee breaks are organised twice a day at three different locations:

1. Entrance hall of De Nieuwe Valk (near registration and information desk and book fair)
 2. Entrance hall of De Oude Valk
 3. Chapel of Hogenheuvelcollege
- These locations will be signposted.

Lunches are included for participants who paid full registration fees (ACSP or AESOP members as well as non-members). Lunches are served at the student restaurant (ALMA – E. Van Evenstraat 2 in Leuven) on Wednesday July 9, Friday July 11 and Saturday July 12. On Thursday July 10, no lunches are provided if you have not signed up for a Mobile Workshop.

Lunches are organized in a self-service system. Included are: soup of the day, main dish (choice from 4 different menus), choice of dessert, 1 drink (soft drink, water or beer).

Lunch tickets have been added in the registration envelopes. Do not forget to take them along to the restaurant as you will be asked for these tickets to pay for the lunch.

LUNCHES ARE NOT INCLUDED for students registrations (reduced fee) and accompanying guests. However, there will be an opportunity to purchase lunch tickets from the Registration and Information desk. Moreover, there's a large choice of restaurants of all types and price categories located in the immediate vicinity of the Congress venue. Public offices and banks are generally open from 09h00 to 16h00 on weekdays (except on Saturdays where banks are sometimes only open until noon). Shops are generally open throughout the day from Monday to Saturday from 9:00 or 10:00 until 18:00 hours. Department stores remain open until 20:00.

Currency and Credit Card

The currency of the European Union is the Euro (€). One Euro is approximately 1,18 US\$ (dd. 17/06/2003). Foreign currency can be exchanged to Euros in most hotels, banks and a number of exchange offices. Foreign currency will not be accepted in shops. Credit cards are widely accepted in all kind of shops. Supermarkets do not always accept credit cards!

Emergency calls

The **emergency number** for medical emergencies and the fire brigade is 100, and for the police and gendarmerie, it is 101. Call 112 for accidents and aggressions.

For the anti-poison centre, call 070/245245.

Electricity

Electricity is supplied in 220 voltages, 50 Hz. Hotels usually offer power adaptors to their guests.

Language

Dutch is the language used in this part of the country. However, a lot of people, especially in this university town, also speak English and French and will have no trouble understanding you.

Medical matters

If you need to consult a doctor during your stay, contact the Information desk to help you make an appointment. Most doctors speak English.

Leuven has two important hospitals, one of them the University Hospital Gasthuisberg. Contact the Information desk for assistance if needed.

During the weekend, special arrangements apply for pharmacies. The name and address of the nearest pharmacist on weekend standby duty is on display at any pharmacy.

Public holiday

Please note that Friday July 11 is a public holiday in Flanders (Part of The Flemish Community). Shops and banks will be closed on this day.

Telephones

Most public phones work with telephone cards. You can buy these cards in post offices, stations, bookshops and newspaper shops. From phone booths with stickers showing flags, you can make international calls. To call abroad from Belgium, first dial 00 followed by the country code. It is cheaper to phone from Monday to Saturday between 8 p.m. and 8 a.m., as well as at any time on Sundays and public holidays.

Tips, Value Added Tax

Tips are included in restaurants, hotels and taxis. All prices for products normally include VAT.
