I wish to apply for the vacancy of Chair of the AESOP Excellence in Education Board. I strongly believe that both my experience and scholarship as a planning academic, alongside my long-term involvement as AESOP co-representative will significantly contribute to satisfy the demands required by this mandate.

As a planning academic, I have acquired broad interest in promoting excellence in planning education, and particularly in contributing to shape cooperative initiatives designed to service AESOP Member Schools. I have followed AESOP's QR process from inception back at AESOP HoS Meeting in Lisbon in 2014. During the 2014-15 term, I led the QR application process of our planning programme at Aalborg University within the frame of the Pilot Phase, and in 2016 I co-chaired the workshop *Revisiting European Standards for Planning Education* at AESOP HoS Meeting in Thessaloniki.

In Denmark, I have been an active contributor in the design and implementation of our planning curricula since 2011. During my combined tenure as assistant and associate professor in the School of Architecture, Design and Planning at Aalborg University, I have contributed to design, develop and instruct a total of 4 theoretical master-level course modules (5 ECTS each) as well as 2 practical master-level project modules (15 ECTS each) per academic year. These course modules belong to the master programmes in Urban Planning and Management (UPM) and in Land Management (LM), and constitute the total coursework required to complete the second semester of each individual master programme. Moreover, I have been active in fostering the internationalisation of these programmes through the exchange and mobility of international students and academics from other planning schools in Europe. In doing so, I have been interested in promoting insightful discussions concerning the status of planning as a profession throughout Europe as well as its new ethos in times of uncertainty. In terms of my own value position regarding contemporary planning education, I abide by the belief that planning should be holistic, practical and inclusive.

In closing, I hold a strong willingness to take responsibility for the overall coordination of the Board and for managing the QR programme that will lead to award AESOP certificates of quality to Member Schools. In doing so, I intend to lead this process on the basis of quality and transparency criteria as the pillars to sustain the forthcoming Standard Phase.

I look forward to discussing this mandate with you and will be pleased to provide further evidence and supporting materials upon request.

Daniel GALLAND is Associate Professor in Urban and Regional Planning in the School of Architecture, Design and Planning at Aalborg University, Denmark. His academic scholarship and skillset build on an interdisciplinary training record and over 10 years of work experience and networking proficiency within diverse professional and scholarly planning environments across Europe, Latin America and North America. His primary research and teaching areas focus on the intersection of spatial planning and development, political science and human geography, currently with an emphasis on metropolitan planning and governance, national-level planning, international comparative planning, as well as planning systems, policies and institutions. He has published extensively in peer-reviewed journals in different European languages, and has wide teaching experience at the graduate level, including courses on planning theory, planning history, spatial planning and governance, and deliberative planning, amongst others.

Daniel is representative, delegate and contact point in Denmark for the Association of European Schools of Planning (AESOP). He is also member of International Academic Working Group (IAK) on “Planning & Governing the Metropolis” at the German Academy for Spatial Research and Planning (ARL) and is a European delegate of the *Red de Investigación sobre Áreas Metropolitanas en Europa y América Latina (RIDEAL)*. He is currently involved in an array of planning projects and consortia in the Nordic countries and has been previously involved in project consortia funded by The European Observation Network for Territorial Development and Cohesion (ESPON). In recent years, he has held visiting appointments in the School of Urban Planning at McGill University, the Institute of Urban and Territorial Studies at the Catholic University of Chile, the University of Barcelona and the Autonomous University of Barcelona.
