Marco Cremaschi' course comprise a multidisciplinary theoretical background followed by a workshop on the southern Italian island of Lampedusa

- + The Jury felt that the module engaged its learners well with a clear contemporary example of a 'wicked problem' – the present refugee crisis in Europe, which is complex, multi-scalar, the result of interrelated dynamics, and defies the 'traditional' models of 'expert-led' definition and resolution.
- + Guided by principles of "investigation", "immersion", "interaction" and "imagination" the module sought to introduce students to a reality where planners are often called upon to work at the interface of many different kinds of knowledge and disciplinary spheres.

- + recommends to investigate urban continuities and changes in a comparative examination including key actors, main policy choices and long-run impacts.
